



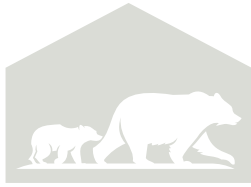

Offers Master's Degree in Apologetics (in both Cultural Apologetics and Philosophical Apologetics), fully online and residential



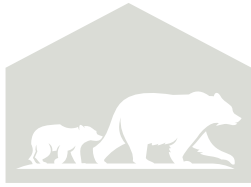
New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary
